1	Internship Program	<p>Our SEU has an established internship program through which students earn academic credit for their participation. During this reporting period, our SEU hosted one (1) student intern from Trident Technical College.</p> <p>Our intern is supervised by our Operations Manager/Program Director. A few examples include, “shadowing” and assisting our on-air personalities both on and off the air, working with production to learn the process of voicing commercials for clients, assisting our promotions technician with remote broadcast set-ups, and learning how to properly award prizes won on-air.</p>
2	Sponsor Event in the Community Designed to Inform and Educate the Public Concerning Employment Opportunities in Broadcasting.	<p>Our SEU hosts a job shadowing program designed to expose students to the field of broadcasting. Students are given the opportunity to observe the inner workings of a radio cluster and follow or “shadow” a member of our broadcast team as he/she goes about his/her duties. Additionally, participants are provided with information about the education and skills required for employment in the broadcast industry.</p> <p>During this reporting period, our SEU hosted two students. On November 29, 2016, students from Harleyville Elementary visited our facilities and “shadowed” one of our On-Air Personalities.</p>

3	Host Job Fair	On June 22, 2017, our SEU hosted an open house at the SEU's studio facilities in North Charleston, South Carolina. SEU representatives spoke with attendees about career opportunities in Promotions, Digital Sales, Sales and On-Air Talent as well as internships within the SEU. The SEU participants included our Business Manager. This event was promoted on all SEU stations.

SEU representatives spoke with attendees about career opportunities in radio broadcasting as well as job openings and internships within the SEU. 6	Participate in event sponsored by or on behalf of an educational institution relating to career opportunities in broadcasting	<p>On September 22, 2016, the SEU’s Senior Marketing Consultant and Program Director participated in the 2016 Trident School Counsel Training (Round Robin). They shared their career experiences, explained their daily work responsibilities within the SEU, and identified workforce needs including the necessary training and courses.</p> <p>On May 25, 2017, one of the SEU’s On-Air Personalities participated in the CE Williams Vehicle/Career Fair. The on-air personality drove an SEU vehicle to the school in order to explain and demonstrate how to use the equipment in the van.</p> <p>Similarly, on June 1, 2017, an SEU on-air personality participated in the Sander Clyde Creative Art School vehicle fair. He also drove an SEU vehicle to the school to explain and demonstrate how to use the equipment in the van. Additionally, he spoke to the students/attendees about the various career opportunities to consider in radio broadcasting.</p> <p>In March 2017, the SEU engaged in an in-kind donation of \$10,000 to the UNCF, which benefits over 8500 students attending UNCF member schools in South Carolina.</p>
